

# Camp Roger Camp Scottie

## 2021 Camp Scottie Day Camp Daily Schedule

Apart from Monday, Day Camp will follow the schedule below. Monday will have additional orientation and community building activities to help us begin the session.

- 7:30 AM**                      **Bus Pick-Up begins** (See Camp Scottie Bus Route sheet for scheduled pick-up times and locations)
- 8:00 – 8:30 AM**              **Camper Drop-Off at Camp Scottie**
- Our front gate opens at 8:00 am for camper drop-off by vehicle. Upon arrival, campers join their counselor and fellow campers for supervised free-play until everyone has arrived for the day.
- 8:30 AM**                      **Flag Raising and Opening Announcements**
- After the bell rings, campers assemble with their counselor and group. We will begin the day by raising the flag. Morning announcements set the stage for the day.
- 8:40 AM**                      **Chapel**
- Camp Roger prayerfully develops a spiritual theme for each summer that is integrated into daily chapels and group devotions, often through skits and stories led by counselors and other staff.
- 9:00 AM**                      **Adventure 1—First Rotation**
- Each session, campers divide into three age-based groups for our three daily adventure times. This allows for programs and activities to be better tailored to the developmental stages of our campers. Campers rotate activities with their group throughout the day.
- Adventure Rotations Include:**
- 1) **Special Program Coordinator:** Each session, a special program coordinator coordinates our weekly theme. They make this adventure even more exciting by bringing in items for campers to interact with.
  - 2) **Adventure in the Woods:** Counselors plan this activity for their camper group. Activities are nature-focused and designed to deepen group relationships. These adventures create appreciation for the awesomeness of God’s creation through include hiking, scavenger hunts, frog-catching, games, and many other activities.
  - 3) **Daily Activity:** These adventures include classic camp activities such as swimming, crafts, fishing, and more. Some daily activities may incorporate the weekly theme.
- Amphibians** (youngest three animal groups)—Special Program Coordinator
- Birds** (middle three animal groups)—Daily Activity
- Mammals** (oldest three animal groups)—Adventure in the Woods

<b>11:30 AM</b>	<p><b>Devotions with Animal Group</b></p> <p>Right before lunch, animal groups connect with God and one another. Counselors lead their group in a special time of reflection through Scripture, stories, singing, praying, or sharing their personal God stories.</p>
<b>11:45 AM</b>	<b>Bathroom/Hand-washing</b>
<b>11:55 AM</b>	<p><b>Lunch</b></p> <p>In Tamarack Lodge, animal groups will sit together around tables to eat. Lunch is a great community building time for campers and counselors.</p> <p>Lunches should be packed and brought to camp each day. Note: pack food that you child likes to eat and that does not need to be warmed up or refrigerated. Along with lunch food, campers will need two additional snacks for morning and afternoon breaks. Campers can use their water bottles at lunch, or you can pack an additional beverage for lunch.</p> <p><b>A special note on allergies:</b> we do not limit the type of food other campers may bring. If your child has food allergies, please contact us before the session begins.</p>
<b>12:25 PM</b>	<p><b>Song-Sing</b></p> <p>At the end of lunch, counselors lead the entire camp in singing. Song-Sing is a beloved tradition that has been a part of Camp Roger’s program for decades. Campers learn family-friendly songs that can be sung anywhere, anytime! Some songs are unique to Camp Roger while others have been adopted from many different sources.</p>
<b>12:40 PM</b>	<p><b>Camp Council</b></p> <p>The entire camp gathers together for announcements, singing, skits, stories, and fun.</p>
<b>1:00 PM</b>	<p><b>Free Time</b></p> <p>Campers have supervised free-play in our playground area.</p>
<b>1:20 PM</b>	<p><b>Adventure 3—Third Rotation</b></p> <p><b>Amphibians</b>—Daily Activity</p> <p><b>Birds</b>—Special Program Coordinator</p> <p><b>Mammals</b>—Adventure in the Woods</p>
<b>2:30 PM</b>	<b>Snack</b>
<b>2:40 PM</b>	<p><b>Camp Clean-Up</b></p> <p>Two important life lessons we teach at Camp are 1) living well with others in a community setting and 2) taking personal responsibility for your belongings. Following afternoon snack, campers gather with their groups to clean up designated areas around camp.</p>

**3:00 PM**

**Afternoon Program (or may include Choice Activities)**

Each afternoon we will have an all camp program. All campers and counselors are involved in playing these larger than life games/events/campfires. Usually on the first and last day of each session, we have a campfire. During the middle three days of each session, we play an epic game or participate in a surprise event!

**Choice Activities:** A Choice Activity is designed to fit campers of all ages. Some typical options are frisbee golf, a short hike with a frog hunt, coloring, and parachute games.

**4:15 PM**

**Flag Lowering/Announcements**

Our day ends by lowering the flag, recapping the fun of the day, and making announcements about the next day. Campers may be given a handout to take home with key information. We will also email you with any important announcements.

**4:30 PM**

**Camper Pick-Up at Camp Scottie**

Drive to the designated pick-up spot, but please stay in your vehicle. We will help you load your camper and get on your way.
